

Introduction

It is proposed to hold the 2018 Moth World Championships in Perth, Western Australia between the 1st and 11th of November, 2018. The bid detailed in the following proposal is supported by the South of Perth Yacht Club, Yachting Western Australia and the members of the Moth Class in Western Australia.

This document is intended to meet the requirements of the International Moth Class Association during the initial selection phase prior to the International body nominating a selected club and venue to.

Should this proposal be successful, this document can form the basis of future documentation to be supplied to the World Council for final agreement.

South of Perth Yacht Club

Brief History

South of Perth Yacht Club was founded on 18 December 1945 with the official opening of the Clubhouse at Olives Reserve on 18 November 1946. Frank Sampson was appointed the very first Commodore until 1949. In 1960 the club was relocated to where it now resides at Coffee Point on the western shore of the Canning River in Applecross.



To promote boating, the club offers a wide range of services for boat owners. These include undercover storage for racing dinghies, hard standing for trailer-able yachts and powerboats, water pens for boats to 25 metres, swing moorings and slipping facilities and an onsite chandlery "Canning River Traders".

The Club has a fully-functional licensed restaurant, with some of Perth's best views overlooking the Swan and Canning Rivers and a clear view of Perth city. The restaurant caters for lunch and dinner as well as special functions. Three bars meet the needs of members and their guests while two outside areas cater for informal al fresco dining and barbecues.

The South of Perth Yacht Club Sailing Academy is Yachting Australia accredited and offers a variety of courses in both sailing and power boating throughout the year. The club also hosts a gymnasium located in the junior clubhouse and equipped with its own trainer. Racing is conducted throughout the year.

Boat Park

There is sufficient space at the South of Perth Yacht Club for the anticipated number of competitors to store, rig, wash and maintain their boats during the event.



Car and Trailer Parking

There is a significant amount of secure car parking and trailer / container storage available at the South of Perth Yacht Club as shown in the following photograph, including the hardstanding area for the Trailer Sailers and Sportsboats, which could also be utilised for some storage if required. 2018 International Moth World Championships Proposal, SoPYC, Perth, WA 7

Launching and Retrieval

South of Perth Yacht Club is arguably the easiest Swan River based yacht club for launching and Retrieving a Moth. There are sand beaches along the entire rigging area, with only a short walk to water deep enough to start sailing a hydrofoil moth. Once sailing, there is direct access to the racing area of Melville Water.

Due to the low tidal range on the Swan River, this entire beach is accessible regardless of the tidal state, and it is highly unusual for the launch area to be affected by weed or other obstacles (moorings etc). The beach can be used for launching regardless of the wind direction or strength with adequate space in all directions off the beach in order to get sailing.

Social Area

An all weather social gathering area is available in the main clubhouse or the dinghy club. During fine weather this area can be opened up, and the verandah and grassed area in front of the club also used for socialization.

For previous moth class events, special licensing was granted to allow the sale of alcohol to competitors in the rigging area post event.

Fresh Water for Boat Wash Down

A number of fresh water taps are available in the rigging and launch areas for wash down of boats after racing. It should be noted that the Swan River is brackish, and as such not as harsh on Moths as ocean water.

Ablutions

Toilets and Showers are available at the club as a part of the dinghy clubhouse. An assessment of the adequacy of the number of toilets can be made closer to the event to ensure that if necessary additional portable toilets can be brought in to service the number of people at the event.

Catering

The South of Perth Yacht Club is a permanently staffed club in regards to catering. Regardless, options to supply adequate catering to participants and spectators will be further planned closer to the event if successful. Options include, but are not limited to:

Arranging a sufficiently sized group of club volunteers to run the SOPYC Galley for the duration of the event.

Engage with a catering firm to run the SOPYC galley for the duration of the event

Engage a Catering firm to supply all aspects of catering for the duration of the event, utilising their own facilities (mobile catering vans etc)

Given the nature of the event the timing of racing will have a direct impact on the demand for catering. It is anticipated that the catering service will be made available to supply food in the hours leading up to boats 2018 International Moth World Championships Proposal, SoPYC, Perth, WA 10

launching and on their return from racing. During racing, subject to spectator demand, this service will continue.

A suitable menu for the event will be prepared in line with the expectations of the sailors, volunteers, spectators and within the capacity of the caterers and South of Perth Yacht Club.

Race Committee / Organisation Space

Registration

A central area in the vicinity of the clubrooms and rigging area will be allocated during the early stages of the event for registration.

Measurement

There are a number of enclosed rooms which will provide space sufficient for the measurement of boats and equipment. It will be ensured that suitable lighting is available at this location to enable the measurement of equipment during the evening if required. Power will be provided for the running of other measurement equipment if needed (scales, computers etc)

Race Committee

A race committee room is available. This location provides a centralised position.

Protest Room

Protests can be heard in the meeting rooms in the main clubhouse. This will provide a private location for the hearing of the protest (if required).

Metocean Information

Summary

The Swan River offers ideal Moth racing conditions. During November the winds in the afternoons (3pm) are from the West or South-West, with the most probable strength being between 10.8kn and 16.2kn (20 and 30km/hr). The water is flat, and not affected by current or swell. The below photograph, taken at the 2010 Nationals held on the Swan River highlights these characteristics.

Waves and Swell

Being an inland water, the Swan River is not subject to ocean swells. Wind waves are present, increasing as the wind speed increases, however these tend to never be greater than 0.5m.


Tide

The Swan River runs into the Indian Ocean at Fremantle Port. Fremantle Port is not significantly tidal, with a maximum tidal range of 0.8m. The tides are mixed at Fremantle, depending on the day there may be one or two high tides in a 24hr period.

Tidal effects on the Swan River are not significant and tend not to have an impact on race courses.

Wind


Perth is famous for its regular afternoon seabreeze, the Fremantle Doctor. This, however is not the be all and end all of wind conditions in Perth. During early November the sea breeze is consistent, however not as strong as is can be later in the summer. In the mornings, an easterly land breeze is common. Wind Statistics are shown in the following plots, with more data included in the Attachments. (Note: windspeeds in below plots are in km/h)

Travel and Accommodation

Travel

Air - Domestic

Perth has regular incoming flights from all four of the main domestic carriers in Perth (QANTAS, Virgin, Jetstar and Tiger). Flights are spaced regularly throughout the day and are direct from Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide. Tasmanian sailors can access Perth by a one stop flight via Melbourne or Sydney.

Specials are available regularly from all airlines, however due to the resources industry's heavy reliance on Eastern States FiFo workers, some flights do fill up quickly, particularly those that link with onward travel into regional WA.

The Perth Domestic terminal is approximately 22km from South of Perth Yacht Club, out of peak times this trip will take approximately half an hour.

Taxi's are available at the airport, the trip to the yacht club will be between \$35 and \$45 subject to the time of day and traffic.

A number of hire car companies operate at the domestic terminal.

Air - International

The International Moth Fleet can be broken down into a number of distinct regions. Sailors are based in Europe, Middle East, Asia (Singapore and Japan), New Zealand, and throughout the USA. The below details travel options for sailors from each region.

Europe

Flights are available from most of the major European Hubs, generally one stop to Perth. Stopovers are available in Hong Kong, China, Singapore, Dubai, Qatar, Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur with the following Airlines:

Middle East

Emirates and Qatar Airways have daily flights direct to Perth. A number of other international airlines also use Dubai as a hub, and as such flights to Perth may be available with these airlines also. Flight time is approximately 11 hours.

Singapore

Regular daily flights operate direct between Perth and Singapore with Singapore Airlines, Qantas, Jetstar and Tiger Airlines. As this is a major tourist route into South East Asia fares are competitive. The flight is approximately 5 hours.

Japan

Flights to Japan are available with a number of airlines via Singapore, Hong Kong, Thailand and Malaysia, and can generally be completed with a stopover in less than 24 hours.

New Zealand

Air New Zealand in partnership with Virgin Airlines flies direct between Perth And Auckland daily, and flights with one stop can be had with Qantas and Jetstar. Travellers can also access flights between Sydney or Melbourne and Auckland and then on to Perth with domestic airlines.

USA

The Main hub for Flights to Australia from the United States is Los Angeles Airport (LAX) via Sydney or Melbourne. Flights are available between these two locations with one or two stops with the following airlines:

Flight times are typically between 20 and 30 hours depending on stopovers.

Road - Domestic

It is possible to travel to Perth by road from the eastern states. Towing a trailer with boats, the trip can take anywhere between 2 to 4 days, depending on the route taken, number of drivers and whether or not the choice is made to drive at night.

Once in Perth, space will be made available at the South of Perth Yacht Club for the storage of trailers and boat boxes.

Public Transport in Perth

Regular and reliable public transport is available in the vicinity of South of Perth Yacht Club. Bus and train timetables are available from the Transperth website as well as maps, ticket and fare information and how to get from point A to point B using Journey Planner. For more information go to <u>http://www.transperth.wa.gov.au</u>.

Accommodation

A wide range of accommodation is available in the greater Perth Metropolitan area, ranging from camp sites to luxury hotels and resorts. In preparing this proposal, we have considered accommodation that is available in the close vicinity of the South of Perth Yacht Club. On the following page is a sample of the accommodation close by the club, which is generally holiday house or apartment type accommodation with a wide range of amenities and costs. Many of these options include multiple rooms, and as such a group of sailors would likely occupy one of these places, significantly reducing the cost per night per sailor.

In order to satisfy the requirement that cheap accommodation options are available nearby the event, it is proposed that camping be made available at the club. The number of spaces will be determined by overall demand and the Council requirements. however it is anticipated that room for up to 20 tents and 20 campervans may be available.

All assistance possible will be provided by the organising committee to assist competitors to find suitable accommodation (including, if required, billeting in volunteers private home). Should South of Perth Yacht Club be selected, local operators will be approached in order to secure discounted rates where possible for advertisement in the Notice of Race.

The South of Perth yacht club is approximately 10min walk from the nearest train station which is a direct line to Perth City. A trip duration of approximately 5 minutes. In the unlikely case of limited accommodation availability adjacent to the venue, significant levels of accommodation are available in the Cite of Perth center

Transport Logistics

Sea Freight

Fremantle Port is Western Australia's primary container port and is located approximately 15km, (22 minutes) from the club. Subject to the freight arrangements made by competitors, the delivery of containers from the port to the club should not cause significant delays.

A number of Container lines offer weekly services to Fremantle Port from Europe, South East Asia and the Americas. Sea transport from Europe and the Americas takes approximately a Month, approximately 1-2 weeks from South East Asia, depending on departure port.

Air Freight

Fifteen air freight companies operate at Perth International Airport, which is located 27km (Approx 40 Minutes) from South of Perth Yacht Club.

Most of the International Airlines visiting Perth Airport have freight options, and as such boats arriving by air shouldn't pose a difficult scenario for sailors to have their boats at the club on time.

Trailer

Competitors traveling from the East Coast of Australia by road with their boats on a trailer will be able to store their trailers at the club for the duration of the event. There are no significant issues in regards to getting trailered boats to the South of Perth Yacht Club.

Exclusivity

A requirement to plan a sailing event on the Swan River is that the water be booked via the Yachting Association of WA. As such, the body of water to be used for the event will be locked out to other clubs for organised racing for the duration of the event. This ensures exclusive access to the proposed water for the duration of the event.

Whilst the South of Perth Yacht Club has the resources to support the 2018 Moth Worlds, it is anticipated that the event will utilize all of the available resources at the club (rigging, clubrooms, catering, storage etc). The South of Perth Yacht Club will not organise additional sailing events at the club during the championships.

Access

The South of Perth Yacht Club has agreed to make space available to competitors arriving before the regatta, as it is understood that some sailors will want to train in local conditions prior to the event. Sufficient space will be made available, and the sailors informed on procedures to ensure that this does not impact on the day to day running of the club in the lead up to the regatta.



Sailors will be requested an ETA at the club prior to the event in order to ensure that their requirements can be aligned with club commitments. 2018 International Moth World Championships Proposal, SoPYC, Perth, WA 21

Past Events

A number of significant events have been held at the South of Perth Yacht Club, and more are planned in the lead up to the Moth Worlds in 2018.

It must be noted, however, that the full capacity of Yachting WA will be leveraged in order to support the 2018 Moth World Championships. The most significant example of the capability of local sailors to organise an event of this magnitude was the Perth 2011 regatta, which was the final major event for Olympic Classes prior to London 2012. Race management personnel from most yacht clubs were trained and gained significant experience in assisting at this event.

Organising Committee

An Organising Committee will be formed from members of IMCA, IMCA-WA, South of Perth Yacht Club and Yachting WA. The members of the committee will have experience in participating in and organising State, National and World Championship regattas. At this early stage it is not possible to advise who will form this committee.

Event Program

It is proposed to run the event in the first two weeks of November 2018 (but subject to feedback from IMCA as the dates could be adjusted). The following contributed to the selection of these dates:

Availability of water and resources, outside of the traditionally busy "Nationals" period between Christmas and New Year.

No racing Saturday Afternoons or Sundays in order to minimise disruption to regular club racing on the river, or the effect of this racing on the Moth World Championships.

Outside of Summer School Holidays in Australia, this should make transport and accommodation more accessible.

Early summer will provide better Moth sailing conditions, particularly in the afternoons as the regular Afternoon Sea Breeze (Fremantle Doctor) will not be at full strength at this time of year.

Financials

Overview

The event is to be funded by entry fees and sponsorships. It is the intent that entry fees for the combined Australian Nationals and World Championships will be kept below \$500 per entrant, including the IMCA fee. This is subject to there not being any significant change in the value of the Australian Dollar over the coming years.

It is anticipated that the management of the finances for the event will be co-operative, with the primary stakeholders being the South of Perth Yacht Club, IMCA-WA, IMCA and IMCA.

Event Sponsorship Opportunities

In order to offset the costs of aspects of the event, sponsorship opportunities will be made available for the following opportunities:

•Event Naming Rights (Tier 1)

•Tier 2 Sponsors

•Post Racing BBQ's

Given the global nature of the event, sponsorship opportunities will be offered to both local, interstate and overseas companies.

In return for the sponsorship funds, sufficient exposure will be provided for the sponsors, commensurate with the level of support provided by the sponsor. A tiered system of sponsorship will be made available.

In regards to sponsorship, it is the intent that only a Naming Rights Sponsor and Tier 2 Sponsors will be required to deliver the main requirements of the regatta that is to provide a world class event on the water for the participants. As planning progresses, additional opportunities for sponsors may be made available in order to further enhance the event in the following ways, or other opportunities that may arise:

Race Committee

ISAF Compliance

The organising committee will ensure compliance with all ISAF requirements for the Race Committee. Some additional details regarding the race committee are detailed below.

Personnel

A Principal Race Officer will be quickly identified in order to run the Moth Worlds 2018 should we be successful in our bid to host.

Additional personnel will be sourced from the South of Perth Yacht Club. Club, as well as other Yacht Clubs on the Swan River (There are 8 other clubs on the river, as well as 4 other ocean clubs in the metropolitan area).

As a legacy of Perth 2011 there are a significant number of race officials who have had exposure to the requirements of supporting a PRO on a course for a significant international event.

Race Consultant

The Organising Committee will work co-operatively with the IMCA nominated race consultant in order to ensure that the plans for the event are in alignment with the expectations of IMCA. Subject to the location of the Race Consultant, regular communications by e-mail, Skype and phone will be arranged in order to progress the arrangements.

International Jury

The Organising Committee will work with IMCA, Yachting WA, Yachting Australia and ISAF to arrange and provide for a compliant International Jury.

The International Jury will be provided with access to a suitable boat for their use during the event, and sufficient space in the race committee office to complete their required business.

Measurement

The Principal Measurer will be provided by IMCA, and space will be allocated to enable the Principle Measurer to perform all measurement duties in the lead up to the event, and during competition.

On The Water

Regatta Courses

Laying of the Regatta courses will be the responsibility of the PRO, however the PRO will be instructed to prepare a course which will take approximately 35 minutes for the first boat to complete in the prevailing conditions.

In order to successfully plan for fleets greater than or less than 80 boats, the organising committee intends to use the following course types.



If less than 80 boats are to be racing at the event then a single windward leeward course is to be used. The



length of the course and the number of laps to be at the discretion of the race committee, and will be detailed further in the sailing instructions.


Greater than 80 Boats

If greater than 80 boats are to be racing at the event then a trapezoidal double windward leeward course is to be used, arranged as follows. The Fleet will be split in half, with the first start to sail on the outer windward leeward course after completing the first beat on the inner course and reaching across to the outer windward mark.

After the first three days of qualifying racing the fleet will be classed in to Gold and Silver and the remaining days raced as finals. Based on previous world championships, this is the likely course arrangement to be used, given that there are likely to be in excess of 100 competitors at the event.

Course Location

The racing will be held primarily on "Melville Water". This is a body of water at the western end of the main expanse of the Swan River. An indicative location for "Melville Water" is shown in the below image.



Safety Coverage

The South of Perth Yacht Club safety management plan will be reviewed in the lead up to the event to ensure that it covers the requirement of a fleet of 100+ high performance boats.

On the assumption that a ratio of 1 safety boat to 10 competitors is a suitable ratio, it is anticipated that as a minimum 10 safety boats will be required. The primary characteristics of safety boats will be that they are RIB type as these are more practical in the recovery of Moths back to the beach.

Safety Officer

The Organising Committee will select a Safety Officer who's responsibility will be the preparation and execution of a suitable safety management plan for the event. The Safety Officer will be on hand at all times during racing and available to co-ordinate suitable response to an emergency during the event.

A suitable communications network will be established between the safety boats and the Safety Officer, most likely using VHF radios on a free frequency not being used by the race committee

It is anticipated that the safety officer will have a background in this type of work be it nursing, paramedic or other form of first responder / crisis management training.

Medical Assistance

A number of major medical facilities with Emergency Departments are available within a short distance of South of Perth Yacht Club . These are summarised in the below table¹.

Check In / Check Out

A system to check in and check out boats from the racecourse will be developed. There are many possible solutions to this problem. Some of these are summarised below, and closer to the event the most practical and effective system will be adopted.

Sign On / Sign Off sheets

Tag On / Tag Off Disc Board

Use of Designated, numbered bays for each competitor. Boats to return to designated bay at end of sailing each day

Electronic Tag On / Tag Off system

A team of Beach Support volunteers will assist in the management of boat trolleys in order to prevent congestion, and these personnel may be utilised to also support the Check In / Check Out process before and after racing.

Jury Boat

A Rigid Inflatable Boat of adequate size and power will be available for the Jury to use as required during race days.

Advertising

The event will be classified as an ISAF Type "C" in respect to advertising on competitors boats, sailors and equipment. A portion of competitors boats will be utilised for the promotion of event sponsors to assist in their return on investment.

Race Equipment

As a legacy of the 2011 ISAF World Championships ("Perth 2011") yacht clubs in Western Australia have access to a significant support for the running of a world class regatta such as large inflatable marks, start boats, rescue boats, radios and highly trained race personnel and mark layers (see




